TIMELINE:

- ◆ December 2019: Owner of 203 Cherry St donates building to RCHFH
- ◆ May 2020: Transformational Housing recognized as a 501c3 non profit organization and assumes ownership
- ◆ November 2020: Demolition complete with volunteer labor
- ◆ January 2021: Renovation begins for 203 Cherry St
- ◆ Summer 2021: Renovation continues / accepting applications for occupants
- ◆ December 2021: Hope to complete renovation
- ◆ 2022 And Beyond: Families developing skills for self-sufficiency
